East Midlands Conference

At the start of my 4th year as your Trustee, it was wonderful to be joined by around 90 people at Eastwood Hall last Wednesday. I am so grateful to the team of people who helped me to organise the first East Midlands Conference for over five years. We were fortunate to be able to hear both the national Chair and Vice Chair speak, and have received many very appreciative comments. I hope that the enthusiasm and ideas generated will continue to spread around the region.

Future Strategy consultation

I am sure you are aware of the ongoing consultation about our future direction. Since the launch of the Development Plan in 2019, life has gone in some very unexpected directions! Publicity and Recruitment

Following on from the work of Chris Hartny-Mills, we want to continue supporting u3as to spread the word about the movement in order to recruit more members. Do put these dates in your diaries. Further information will follow.

We are providing 2 virtual sessions on Publicity and Recruitment:

Wednesday 24th November 2-4pm <u>or Monday 29th November 2-4pm</u>.

The purpose is

- 1. To encourage u3as to identify Publicity as an integral role within their committee: the role to be ongoing local profile raising and recruitment of new members.
- 2. To entice some individuals to support PR activities within the East Midlands and to work with other PR and Media Advisers across the UK.

The sessions will include marketing ideas and materials, items from the Pathfinders toolkit and examples from u3as.

According to recent (pre pandemic) analysis done by Ed Link, the East Midlands has the highest density of members as a % of people aged 65 or older in the country. Whilst we should feel very proud of this we are still only talking about just over 7% (compared to under 2% in the NE) so there is still plenty of opportunity for recruitment.

40th Anniversary

At the end of our Conference Michaela Moody, Vice Chair of the Third Age Trust, told us about the plans that are being made for the 40th Anniversary of the u3a movement, next year. These include the Quilt competition and Wood that have already been publicised, but also intergenerational
